The Royal was as expected a spectacular event, with opportunities to hunt for and to purchase new treasures, to listen to informative speakers, to reconnect with fellow stamp enthusiasts, and to view and to appreciate many outstanding exhibits.

The following impressive research based exhibits are some that captured my attention.

- Airmail to Canada's Gold Fields, 1924-1926 (Gold, Neil Hunter)
- Canadian Errors & Varieties During the Elizabethan Era (Vermeil, Doug McAndless)
- World War1 Messages Home in Silk (Vermeil, Doreen Fitzgerald)
- In Defense of the Border Canadian Military Mails, 1628-1885 (Court of Honour, David Hobden)
- The 1994 Great Britain Definitive Mini Sheet A 20 Year History (Silver, David Gooderham)

The Exhibits such as the ones noted above not only preserve history but set the mark. They raise the bar by demonstrating commitment and excellence. As well they encourage us to learn more and to delve deeper in the hobby, encouraging us to bring order and to find the stories hiding or lost in our collections and accumulations stuck in the corners and stock books of our stamp rooms.
