Thank you for the part you individually play, whether you were able to attend or not, to enable the success of WTSC.


The commemorative keepsake package shown will be mailed to long distance members and will be available at our upcoming in-person meetings for local members who were unable to attend the event.



MAY LEARNING WORKSHOP

Starting at 7 p.m., Tuesday, May 6, 2025 via Zoom, the topic for our eighth virtual Learning Workshop of the 2024-2025 season is: "Elizabethan Issues before 1960."

Queen Elizabeth II (1926-2022) was not only featured on myriad British Commonwealth country's definitives and commemoratives — from 1952 until her death in 2022 — she was also depicted on earlier issues as a young princess.

There isn't time to go into it all, but there are plenty of stamps including omnibus issues many countries produced including 1953 Coronation commemoratives, plus varieties and postal history before and during her early years on the throne.



The world's first Princess Elizabeth stamp was a 6-cent dark blue 1932 Newfoundland definitive. The colony issued others in 1938, a 1941 reprint with different perfs, and in 1947.



Canada's first commemorative with a portrait of the princess is a green 1-cent in a 1935 set of five commemorating the 25th anniversary of her grandfather King George V's reign. A popular variety, the 'Weeping Princess' on the 21st stamp on a Plate 1 pane of 100 has slight engraving damage that looks like a teardrop under her right eye.

She was next on a Canadian stamp with her sister Princess Margaret, in a 1939 set of three produced for the only tour by their parents,

King George VI and Queen Elizabeth — the Queen Mother. Next was a single 4-cent 1948 stamp with Princess Elizabeth's portrait, commemorating her 1947 marriage to Prince Phillip. The couple are on a 1951 4-cent issued for their first visit to Canada, and one released in 1957 for their next visit.



Interesting to note is that the 1948 commemorative was based on a photo by Dorothy Wilding, of London, England — who provided another official photograph for the 1954 set of Queen Elizabeth II definitives. They replaced a 1953 set based on a picture of the new monarch by Ottawa photographer Yousuf Karsh. He also took the photo used for an engraved Coronation 4-cent commemorative Canada issued in 1953.



Both the Karsh and Wilding stamps provided collectors with numerous topics, including corner marginal blocks with different plate numbers, some denominations with precancels, some with perforated company initials, plus 'G' overprints for use on mail at federal government offices. The 'Wildings' were also the first Canadian stamps with phosphor overprints applied for use in Winnipeg, as a security measure recognized by high-volume post office cancelling machines.

Stamps issued by other countries include some bearing portraits of Princess Elizabeth and her sister. British issues featuring Queen Elizabeth II began in 1952 based on a Wilding portrait

photograph. Those 'Wildings' include definitives with different watermarks and perforations, plus a set with sorting machine-

triggering graphite black lines on the backs.

Finally, for postal history fans, covers mailed to foreign destinations are also worthwhile.




