WTSC CIRCUIT REPORT - Simon Claughton

On October 5th our "A and B" circuit teams took the circuit to the Woodstock Circuit Fair which saw us bring in \$385 with 17 customers participating.

On October 8th our circuit team had the circuit at our WTSC Meeting, which saw us bring in \$85 with 10 customers participating.

The Circuit team has been invited the Hamiliton Circuit Day on November 1st, and we expect another very good day.

WTSC CIRCUIT BOOK MANAGER ROLE- Looking for a new manager!!

Please review this detailed list of duties/actions, that with a team of helpers needs to be managed - *Outlined in comprehensive step by step detail by Victoria our soon to retire Circuit Book Manager.*

At meetings/events

- Bring the binders to the meetings or events
- Staff the circuit table during meetings (there are helper teams)
- Total and check sales slips
- Receive payments and make change
- Receive new pages submitted by members

After the meetings/events

- Reconcile the meeting or event sales as described below
- Sanity-check the Excel totals for the date against a rough count of the sales slips or cashbox contents
- Remove completed empty pages and return to members
- Document new pages as described below and place them into the binders

Circuit book administration

- Entering new pages
- Sort by country
- Date stamp at the top, using date pages received (typically the meeting date) · Write in a number for each page, by checking the spreadsheet and ensuring no duplication of numbers (use the 30,000's if no convenient and sufficiently large range round)
- Insert new lines for these pages in the spreadsheet (note that countries are fairly mixed up: a total renumbering might be a good idea going forward)
- Enter the page number, book number, country, member number, date entered, and initial total page value for each submitted page, columns A to F
- Check that member number is entered correctly (important for reconciliation) · Place the pages in the appropriate binder (or use a "new pages" binder)

Reconciling after a circuit book meeting or event

- Create a new column for the meeting or event date after the previously used date
- Locate the pages referred to by the sales slips (searching the spreadsheet by page number will provide the book number in column B)
- Note that sales slips will often have consecutive pages in the same book, making following these straightforward
- Verify the removed item's price against the empty space on the circuit page
- Enter the totals into the appropriate page line/date column cell, using the values on the circuit page (NOT the sales slip) (letting Excel do the adding within the cell is useful)
- Date stamp the empty cell where stamp used to be
- If no match is found on sales slips, enter missing stamp value into the unaccounted cell (at the bottom of the spreadsheet) for that date
- If an obvious underpayment is made, enter the shortfall into the not/short paid cell for that date · If a payment made but stamp is not taken, enter the amount into the overpaid cell for that date

Starting at 7 p.m., Tuesday, December 3, 2024 via Zoom, the topic for our third virtual Learning Workshop of the 2024-2025 season is: **"End of Year Festivities."**

For this wide-ranging subject, almost anything goes.

Naturally we'd like to hear about your favourite Christmas stamps.

Of particular historical interest, the world's first to bear that reference was Canada's two-cent Imperial Penny Postage map stamp with 'XMAS 1898' printed at the bottom.



Of particular interest is this year marking the 60th anniversary of



Canada's post office decking the halls with annual Yule-season commemoratives. Indeed, there has been more than 200 different designs.



The first set, in 1964, was a pair of small-format engraved stamps featuring a couple in silhouette, holding hands with their son and daughter. The family is standing in snow, with evergreen trees in the distance, looking into the sky lit by the Star of Bethlehem.



Other festivities in the latter months and early in the New Year that have been featured on stamps include Hanukkah, Eid, Diwali, plus outdoor activities including skiing, hockey, skating, tobogganing, and sleigh-riding.

Many foreign countries have also issued Christmas-theme stamps, with a wide variety of subjects.
