## November Learning Workshop

Centennial Year — 1967 — was a birthday to remember for Canadians.

The 100th anniversary of Confederation also yielded a new series of stamps.

The definitives started with low-denomination definitives featuring Queen Elizabeth II in a new design that included Canadian scenes in the background. The larger mid to high-value denominations, from eight cents to \$1, featured single-colour engravings that reproduced paintings of sites across the country.

In addition to sheet-format stamps, coils were issued, along with various denominations in booklets. There were also precancelled stamps, postal stationery, plus additional low-value denominations showing the queen in front of new backgrounds.

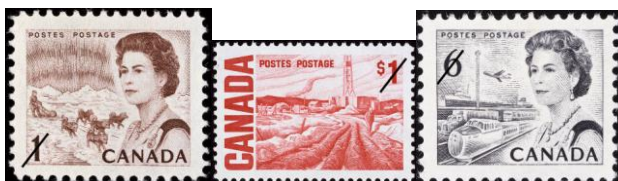
More important, for students of philately, there were subsequent different printings, tagging, gums and varying paper fluorescence, providing collectors with a field day to study and collect varieties with which to fill album pages, mostly at inexpensive to moderate expense to this day.

Our club's second Learning Workshop on November 1 will offer members a chance to share their interest in the Centennial Issue, at varying levels.

The meeting offers everyone a chance to participate, discuss how far you've gone — or wish to go — with this interesting series of stamps.
