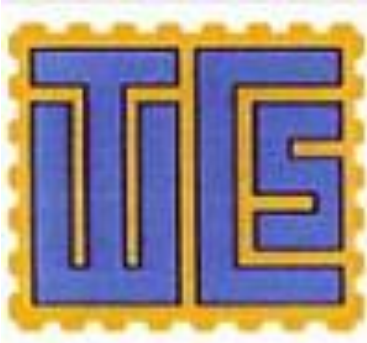

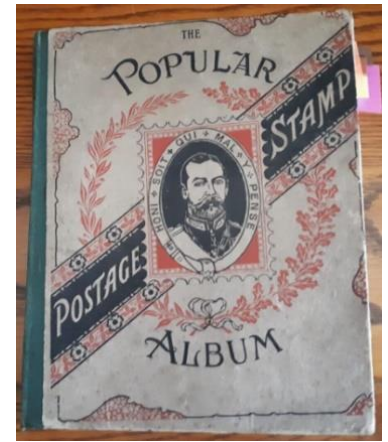

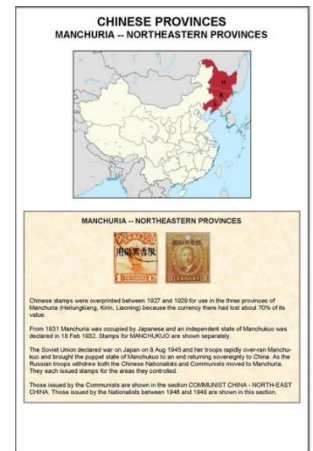
Many people continued to enjoy subjects from around the world, while others branched onto more specific themes, including stamps from a favorite country, stamps featuring a specific or various topics, revenue stamps, postage dues, plus postal history.



How to house a collection is one of the earliest questions we all pondered. In addition, how do you best house a study, research project or exhibit in the process of development?

Are stamps left in stockbooks, perhaps with notes on slips of paper that describe the subject?

Various albums are available, some with simple listings and artwork, others with extensive illustrations and descriptions of varieties. Some collectors prefer to draw their own pages — or include some personalized pages in preprinted albums.



In our modern world, computer online programs provide optional layouts and text styles with which album pages can be designed and printed.

You can receive suggestions and advice, but in the end, you collect what you want, the way you want.

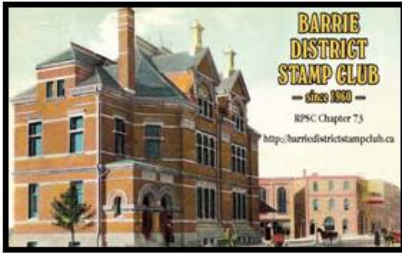
